This year, many North Koreans will make the treacherous journey across the Tumen River and into China, fleeing starvation and oppression in their homeland.

Once in China, the majority of the women and girls will be sold as "brides" or otherwise sexually exploited and abused.

And if these desperate refugees are discovered by the Chinese authorities, they will be forced to go back to North Korea, where they may face prison camps and possibly even execution.

These North Korean refugees are not criminals. They seek what every human being is entitled to: a life of dignity.

Meanwhile, the North Korean regime continues to oppress its people even as it lets them starve, and the Chinese government continues to flout international refugee law. North Korean refugees desperately need the help of the international community.

Life Funds for North Korean refugees was founded in 1998 as a Japanese Non-Profit Organization providing vital assistance to North Korean refuges. Our activities helping North Korean refugees have since expanded, and include the following:

- Providing refugees with food, clothing, and medicine;
- Working with our networks in China to provide refugees with shelter:
- Assisting refugees in China and Russia, who are in grave danger, to enter a third country safely;
- Providing assistance with school fees and supplies to children born of a North Korean mother and Chinese father through our Education Sponsorship Program; (these children have no Chinese citizenship, and few rights)
- Advocating for vulnerable refugees and calling for their treatment as refugees according to the International Convention on the Status of Refugees;
- Providing support and assistance to refugees who have settled in Japan.
